Scholarship Information Inside

About the Scholarships

The AFSCME Ohio Council 8 Scholarship Program was created in 1982 to provide financial assistance to the children of Ohio Council 8 members to attend a four-year accredited college or university. The scholarships, two \$2,500-a-year grants for four years, are awarded annually to two different recipients, one male and one female, based on the applicant's need, academic history and higher education goals. Scholarship applications are reviewed by the union's executive board, which will award the two scholarships no later than June 30, 2010.

Eva Burris and Sol Marble

Cincinnati union leader Sol Marble had three AFSCME leadership careers spanning more than 40 years.

His first AFSCME career began when he became a City of Cincinnati park district employee in 1958, and joined AFSCME Local 250, which has represented city workers since 1954. Marble helped build the union at every level rising through the ranks to become Local 250 President.

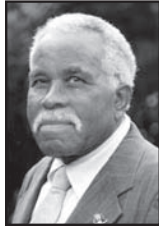
From 1979 until retiring in 1985, Marble was the AFSCME Ohio Care Plan office manager in the Cincinnati office. After retiring, he was one of a core group of 100 retired public employees who organized AFSCME Ohio Retiree Chapter 1184, which represents Ohio Council 8, OCSEA/AFSCME Local 11, and OAPSE/AFSCME Local 4 retirees.

In 1998 Marble stepped down as leader of Retiree Chapter 1184 after 10 years of service as the organization's first president. He died in 2002.

Eva Burris started with Council 8 as a staff representative in the Youngstown Region in 1987. In 1992, she was appointed Regional Director, a post she held until 2000, when she left AFSCME. She also served as Vice President of the Greater Youngstown AFL-CIO and was Labor Chair of the Mahoning Valley Labor management Citizens Committee.

Burris went on to serve as Administrator of the Mahoning County Court of Common Pleas Juvenile Division. She retired from the court in 2005. In 2008, Ohio Attorney General Richard Cordray appointed Burris as his representative on the Ohio Public Employee Retirement System Board of Trustees.

Burris lives in Youngstown and is still active in her community.



Guidelines

Please Review the Following Before Submitting an Application ELIGIBILITY

An applicant's parent must be an AFSCME Ohio Council 8 affiliated local union member who has been in good standing for at least one (1) calendar year prior to May 3, 2010.

An applicant must graduate from high school in the year in which application for the scholarship is made.

An applicant must attend a four (4) year accredited college or university as a full-time student.

Children of members of the AFSCME Ohio Council 8 Executive Board or of any staff member of the Council are not eligible for participation in the scholarship program.

Applications must be **postmarked** no later than **Monday, May 3, 2010**. Applications which are incomplete, or which are postmarked after the specified date, will be ineligible for consideration.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

An applicant must submit with his/her application two essays, each between 350 and 500 words in length. One essay is to describe why the applicant wants to attend college; the other is to describe the effect their parent's membership in AFSCME has had on their family and on them at a personal level. Content, grammar, spelling and appearance will be considered.

An applicant must submit his/her high school transcript and a written recommendation from a high school guidance counselor or teacher who has personal knowledge of the applicant.

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Scholarship funds will be pro-rated in accordance with the college or university's academic year. Applicants awarded a scholarship will be provided with detailed information as to the requirements for proof of tuition fee payment and full-time status at the time the scholarship award is made.

Scholarship funds will be paid for any quarter or semester during which the student is enrolled full-time and has submitted proof of out-of-pocket education expenses. Reimbursable education expenses are limited to tuition or other university/college fees, expenses for textbooks and expenses for room and board, including any university/college-sponsored meal programs. Proof of out-of-pocket education expenses must be provided. Proof of out-of-pocket education expenses may include payment toward a student loan(s). Scholarship funds will not be paid for any quarter or semester in which a student has no out-of-pocket education expenses due to the receipt of other grants, scholarships or tuition waivers.

If, during the four-year eligibility period, a student leaves school for any quarter or semester except summer, the scholarship will be terminated for the period the individual is not a student or is a part-time student.

The scholarship will be terminated at any point the student's parent ceases to be a member in good standing of the union for any reason, except retirement or death. The scholarship will be terminated if the student fails to maintain a passing grade point average.

Termination will be effective with the beginning of the next semester or quarter following the date the parent terminated union membership.
